NEIL PATRICK EDWARD FOX, CD

04 April 1920 - 14 August 2008

Neil P.E. Fox was a Member of the Canadian Association of Veterans in United Nations Peacekeeping and a member of the Ottawa Chapter, Ottawa, Ontario.

Neil joined the Canadian Army in August 1939 as an Infantry Officer and during his military career served with the Royal Canadian Regiment (RCR), the Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry and the Canadian Airborne Regiment.

Neil was not only a peacekeeper, having served with United Nations Truce Supervision Organization in Palestine (UNTSO) during the period November 1960 - November 1961, but he also was a World War II Veteran.

Neil was also a member of the Royal Canadian Regiment Association, the Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry Association and the Canadian Airborne Association.

DONALD L. MCLEAN, CD

09 March - 02 August 2008

Donald L. McLean was a Charter Member of the Canadian Association of Veterans in United Nations Peacekeeping, one of the Founding Member of the Calgary Alberta Chapter, Member of the LGen R.R. Crabbe Chapter, Winnipeg, Manitoba and was the Founding President of the Spr Christopher Holopina, Chapter, Brandon, Manitoba. Don has been a member of the Association since 1989.

Don joined the Canadian Army in August 1958 as a Transport Operator in the Royal Canadian Army Service Corp (RCASC) and later re-mustered as a Vehicle Mechanic in the Royal Canadian Electrical and Mechanical Engineers (RCEME).

Donald L. McLean served a number of United Nations Peacekeeping missions throughout the Middle East and Africa. He served with the United Nations Emergency Force II (UNEF II) May - November 1974. This tour included the contentious 1974 Turkish invasion of Cyprus whereas Don and many of his colleagues were tasked to augment the Canadian Forces in Cyprus. He served with the United Nations Forces in Cyprus (UNFICYP)

March - October 1982; United Nations Disengagement Observer Force (UNDOF) October 1985 - April 1986 and United Nations Transition Group (UNTAG) August 1989 - January 1990.

For his outstanding service to his country, in 2003 one of the streets in Garrison Green, Calgary, Alberta near Peacekeepers Park was renamed "Don McLean Avenue".

Donald was a long-standing Member of the Royal Canadian Legion, an active member within his church and was involved with various minor sports teams.

Charles David Beaton was a Charter Member of the Canadian Association of Veterans in United Nations Peacekeeping and a Founding Member of the William Hall VC Greenwood Chapter, Greenwood, NS. Chuck had joined the Association on 13 December 1988.

Chuck joined the Royal Canadian Air Force as a Fighter Control Operator and then as an Air Traffic Controller.

Chuck served in Egypt with United Nations Emergency Force (Middle East) in 1978/1979. He was also an active member of Branch 098 Royal Canadian Legion, Kingston, NS.

Bruce E. Reid was a member of the Canadian Association of Veterans in United Nations Peacekeeping and an active member of the Calgary Chapter, Calgary, Alberta.

Bruce joined the Canadian Army in February 1959 with the Royal Canadian Army Pay Corp. He served with Canadian Contingent United Nations Emergency Force (Middle East) in Cairo, Egypt. Bruce also served in the Golan Heights with the United Nations Disengagement Observation Force.

Bruce was also presented a Certificate of Appreciation for his Dedication and Professionalism as Treasurer of the Calgary Chapter during the period 1992 - 2002.

Thus, Jim proudly served wearing the blue beret with 56 Reconnaissance Troop, 1st Fort Gary Horse in Egypt with the United Nations Emergency Force in the Gaza Strip.

Brian joined the Royal Canadian Air Force in March 1958 and served until his retirement in April 1989. His service career took him to Germany with NATO Forces during the period 1962 - 1967. Brian also served tours at Air Bases located in Nova Scotia and British Columbia.

The Canadian Landmine Foundation has added a sixth honouree to its mine detection dog training project to note the passing of Brian Isfeld. This year the Canadian Landmine Foundation set out to fund the training of five mine detection dogs. The first, will be called Izzy in honour of Brian's son, MCpl Mark Isfeld, the second will be named Paul in honour of Cpl Paul Davis, the third will be named Jeff in honour of MCpl Jeffery Walsh, the fourth will be named boomer in honour of Cpl Andrew Eykelenboom, and the fifth will be named Carol in honour of Mrs. Carol Isfeld.

Brian had also been an active member of the Canadian Peacekeeping Veterans Association and the Royal Canadian Legion, Branch 17, Courtenay, B.C.
