Robert Anthony (HUEY) Hubert, MMM, CD

07 February 1934 - 21 December 2009

Robert A. Hubert was a member of the Canadian Association of Veterans in United Nations Peacekeeping and was a member of the Calgary Chapter, Calgary, Alberta.

Robert enlisted in the Canadian Army at Fort Osborne Barracks, Winnipeg, Manitoba in March 1952 joining Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry (PPCLI). He served with the 3rd Battalion in the Korean War from 1953 - 1954.

Robert served three tours with United Nations Force in Cyprus (UNFICYP) with the 1st Battalion PPCLI in 1968, 1971 and in 1981. He also served in United Nations Disengagement Observation Force Golan Heights (UNDOF) in 1975 as a Transport Driver with an additional three-month tour in Ismailia, Egypt as a driver.

Robert was also a member of the Royal Canadian Legion Branch 264, Calgary for thirty-two years.

Maurice Boucher, CD

Maurice Boucher, was a member of the Canadian Association of Veterans in United Nations Peacekeeping, Major-General Alain R. Forand Chapter, Québec. He was also a member of the Association du Royal 22e Régiment, Fort St-Jean Chapter and a member of the Royal Canadian Legion, Branch 079 Richelieu in Saint-Jean-sur-Richelieu.

Maurice enlisted in the Canadian Army in North Bay, Ontario as an infantryman on November 30th, 1961, and joined the Royal 22e Régiment. He served in Valcartier QC, Werl and Lahr Germany, Cyprus in 1969 and 1981-1982, then CFB St-Jean and CFB Montreal. He retired from the Forces on February 3rd, 1994, after 33 years and two months of service.

He was V-P (2005 à 2006) and President (2006-2008) of the Major-General Alain R. Forand Chapter of CAVUNP. He also served as Secretary of the Fort St-Jean Chapter of the Association du Royal 22e Régiment, and as Entertainment Director and executive committee member of the Royal Canadian Legion, Branch 079 Richelieu. He will be missed by all.

Maurice Boucher CD, était membre de l'Association canadienne des Vétérans des Forces de Paix des Nations Unies, Succursale Major-Général Alain R. Forand, Québec. Il était également membre de l'Association du Royal 22e Régiment, succursale Fort St-Jean ainsi que de la filiale 079 Richelieu de la Légion royale canadienne à Saint-Jean-sur-Richelieu.

Il s'est enrôlé dans l'Armée canadienne à North Bay, Ontario, le 30 novembre 1961 en tant que fantassin au sein du Royal 22e Régiment. Il servit à Valcartier QC, Werl et Lahr Allemagne ainsi que Chypre en 1969 et 1981-1982 et par la suite BFC St-Jean et BFC Montréal. Le 3 février 1994 Maurice prend sa retraite des Forces armées canadiennes après 33 ans et 2 mois de service.

Il fut vice-président (2005 à 2006) ainsi que président (2006 à 2008) de la Succursale Major-Général Alain R. Forand de l'ACVFPNU Maurice fut par le passé, secrétaire de la Succursale Fort St-Jean de l'Association du Royal 22e Régiment; il fut aussi directeur des loisirs et était membre du comité exécutif de la filiale 079 Richelieu de la Légion royale canadienne de St-Jean-sur-Richelieu. Joseph L. Mahé was a member of the Canadian Association of Veterans in United Nations Peacekeeping and was a member of the Calgary Chapter, Calgary, Alberta.

Joseph was a veteran of World War II and rejoined the Canadian Army in 1949. He served with the Royal Canadian Regiment and with the Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry. He completed a tour with the NATO Forces Stationed in Germany. Joseph also served in Korea during the Korean Conflict.

Joseph completed two United Nation Tours: one with the United Nations Emergency Force (Egypt) and the 2nd with United Nations Force in Cyprus.

Joseph was also an active member of the Royal Canadian Legion Branch 264 (Kensington), in Calgary, Alberta.

David Wayne Young

Corporal David Wayne Young (Retired) was a member of the Canadian Association of Veterans in United Nations Peacekeeping and was the Founding President of the Southwestern Ontario Chapter, Courtland, Ontario.

Dave joined the Canadian Army in October 1957 as a Royal Canadian Electrical Mechanical Engineer (RCEME) Tradesman.

Dave served with the 56 Canadian Infantry Workshop, Camp Rafah, Egypt with the United Nations Emergency Force from July 1963 to September 1964.

Dave was also an active member of the Royal Canadian Legion Branch 153 in Tillsonberg, Ontario. He served as a 1st Vice President of the Branch, as Sgt-at-Arms, as a Service Officer, as an Air Cadet Liaison Officer and as a B2 District Zone Commander.

Dave also was one of four founders and the main driving force of the Tillsonberg Canadian Military Heritage Victoria Cross Tattoo.

Kenneth C.W. Bourgeau, CD

24 November 1932 - 25 October 2009

Major Kenneth C.W. Bourgeau, CD (Retired) was a member of the Canadian Association of Veterans in United Nations Peacekeeping and a Chapter member of the Prince Edward Island Chapter, Charlottetown, PEI.

Ken joined the Royal Canadian Army Service Corps (RCASC) in 1952 and, following officer training that included field experience in Germany, was posted to Nova Scotia where he served in administrative, transport and supply positions.

His next assignment as a recruit training supervisor at The RCASC School in Camp Borden was interrupted by a peacekeeping tour with the United Nations India-Pakistan Observer Mission where he served on both sides of the common border.

From Camp Borden, Lt Bourgeau was transferred to Alberta where he assumed supply duties at Camp Wainwright. Included was responsibility for two giant gasoline storage tanks. Here, in the face of possible disaster, Ken's ever-present sense of humour came into play. Early one fine morning in 1962, it was discovered that some 5,000 gallons of gasoline had leaked from a tank overnight. Soon, the Camp Fire Marshall was on the scene. Taking such matters as the proximity to PMQs, a river, soil conditions, etc., into consideration, it was decided to protect the tanks with a wall of water and burn off the spilled gasoline. With the fire raging, an equally raging Camp Commander arrived on the scene and demanded, "Bourgeau, did you light this fire?" Ken calmly replied, "No, Sir! I just supplied the match!"

On retirement from regular service, he was called back to uniform as the Provincial Warning Officer in Charlottetown.

Two other military duties were very important to Ken. Late in his regular career, he journeyed to Halifax annually to be the Logistics Officer for the Canadian Forces Tattoo. Later, he dedicated much of his time to his beloved cadets! As Area Cadet Instructor Cadre Officer, he was responsible for all cadet programs in P.E.I. and, for four years, he served on the board of the Army Cadet League of P.E.I.

As a faithful CAVUNP member, Ken Bourgeau's favourite motto was: "Better to keep the peace than to have to make peace!"

Jack served with the United Nations Emergency Force in Egypt with the 56 Canadian Infantry Workshop and completed two United Nations tours in Cyprus. One in 1964 - 1965 with the Royal Canadian Guards and the 2nd tour with the Royal Canadian Regiment in 1974 - 1975.

He was also a member of Branch 513, The Royal Canadian Legion in Dorchester.

Perley enlisted in the Canadian Army in January 1955, first with the West Nova Scotia Regiment, and then transferred to the Black Watch (RHR) of Canada and later to the Royal Canadian Army Service Corps. Perley retired after 35 years of service. Following his retirement, he spent a number of years in the Canadian Reserves.

Perley served in United Nations Force in Cyprus from April to October 1966.

He was also a member of the Royal Canadian Legion Branch No. 98, Kingston, Nova Scotia, the Black Watch Association, Atlantic Branch and the Royal Canadian Army Service Corps Association.
