Drayton Junior Cousineau was a Chartered member of the Canadian Association of Veterans in United Nations Peacekeeping and was a member of the William C. Hall VC, Greenwood Chapter, Kingston, Nova Scotia.

Drayton served two terms as President of the Greenwood Chapter during the period 25 Apr 1995 to 20 October 1999 and during the period 17 January 2001 to 17 October 2001. He also served as the Nova Scotia Provincial Director from 01 December 2002 to 18 September 2004.

Drayton joined the Canadian Army in December 1950 and after 21 years of Service, he retired in January 1971. He served with the United Nations Emergency Force in Egypt during 1958/1959.

Drayton was a member of the Royal Canadian Legion, Branch 98, Kingston, Nova Scotia. He was also a Past Grand Knight, 4th Degree, Knights of Columbus.

Léo Boulet, CD

27 July 1935 - 6 May 2010

Léo Boulet, CD was a founding member of the Canadian Association of Veterans in the United Nations Peacekeeping Programme, Major-General Alain R. Forand Chapter, Québec. He was also a member of the Association du Royal 22e Régiment, Fort St-Jean Chapter and a member of the Royal Canadian Legion, Branch 079 Richelieu in Saint-Jean-sur-Richelieu.

On November 12, 1957, Léo enlisted in the Canadian Army as an infantryman, at the age of 22, when, after Basic training, he then joined the Royal 22e Régiment. Throughout his career he served in Valcartier, QC with the 2e R22eR, then with the 1st R22eR in Werl and in Lahr Germany, and served two tours with the United Nations, one in Congo in 1961-1962 and the second in Cyprus, from March to September 1964.

In 1972, upon his return from Germany he joined the 2e R22eR and worked at the Officer's mess at La Citadelle, Québec (QC). In 1979, he was posted at CFB Montreal, St-Hubert and Farnham Detachment. He retired from the Forces on December 26th, 1986, in Farnham after 29 years of service.

Léo was awarded the following medals: Special Service Medal (SSM), the Canadian Peace Keeping Medal (CPSM), the United Nation Organization in Congo Medal (ONUC), United Nation Forces in Cyprus Medal (UNIFICYP) and the Canadian Decoration Medal (CD).

Léo Boulet CD, était membre fondateur de l'Association canadienne des Vétérans des Forces de Paix des Nations Unies, Succursale Major-Général Alain R. Forand, Québec. Il était également membre de l'Association du Royal 22e Régiment, succursale Fort St-Jean ainsi que de la filiale 079 Richelieu de la Légion royale canadienne à Saint-Jean-sur-Richelieu.

Il s'est enrôlé dans l'Armée canadienne le 12 novembre 1957, à l'âge de 22 ans, en tant que fantassin au sein du Royal 22e Régiment. Il servit à Valcartier au 2e R22eR, QC, au 1er R22eR à Werl et à Lahr, en Allemagne ainsi que pour 2 missions onusiennes. La première au Congo en 1961/62 ensuite à Chypre de mars à septembre 1964. En 1972 à son retour d'Allemagne il fut muté à La Citadelle de Québec au 2e R22eR où il travailla au mess des officiers.

Il fut ensuite muté à la BFC Montréal, détachement St-Hubert et termina sa carrière au détachement de Farnham le 26 décembre 1986 après 29 ans de loyaux services.

Léo était le récipiendaire de la Médaille du Service Spéciale (MSS), la Médaille canadienne du maintien de la paix (MCMP), la Médaille des Opérations des Nations Unies au Congo (ONUC), la médaille de la Force des Nations Unies à Chypre (FUNUC) et de la Décoration des Forces canadiennes (CD).
